Dear Past Pupils and Friends of Don Bosco,

I am deeply honoured to present this report as we gather for our Extraordinary General World Assembly (EGWA2024) in the heart of our beloved Don Bosco's home – Valdocco – Turin. This Assembly is not just a meeting but a significant milestone in our collective journey. It provides us with the opportunity to reflect on our achievements, address our challenges, and chart a path for the future. Together, we embark on a new journey to strengthen the bonds among past pupils worldwide and to uphold the values that Don Bosco instilled in us. We are here to take a new journey together.

- Maintaining consistent engagement among members across different regions
- Adapting to digital tools for effective communication and collaboration.
- Addressing varying needs and expectations of our diverse membership and diverse cultural and spiritual traditions.

- Enhanced Communication: Implement regular virtual meetings and updates to keep us all informed and engaged on local, national, and international levels.
- **Training and Development:** We should organize workshops and education activities aimed at leadership skills and community engagement practices.
- Youth Involvement: We need to develop programmes that specifically target young past pupils and friends who belong to the Salesian Family to ensure the continuity of our association's vision.
- Local activism: We should promote more local activism and local union life as the spirit of Past Pupils needs to be lived in everyday situations in our everyday lives.

As we move forward, let us reaffirm our commitment to the values instilled in us by Don Bosco. By working collaboratively and embracing the spirit of unity and synodality, we can build a vibrant and supportive global community of past pupils and friends of Don Bosco. I look forward to the fruitful discussions and decisionmaking that will take place during this Assembly, confident that together, we can achieve great things.

I would like to extend my deepest gratitude to all active member of the Presidency of World Confederation for their unwavering dedication and hard work. Special thanks go to the organizing committee of EGWA2024 for their outstanding efforts in bringing us together in Turin this year.
