Here are the guidelines for the performance:

### **Performance Guidelines**

#### 1. Cultural Representation

• Sharing our Culture: This is a good opportunity to showcase your culture in a fun way! We'd love to see authentic culture from your country, but above all, we want to have fun!

### 2. Cultural Sensitivity

- **Mindful Representation:** Be mindful of cultural sensitivities, avoiding any content that could be seen as disrespectful or offensive to any culture.
- Avoid Stereotypes: Represent your chosen culture with accuracy and depth, avoiding stereotypes or oversimplifications.

### 3. Performance Time Limit

• **Maximum Duration:** Each performance should not exceed **5 minutes**. A presentation showcasing cultural traditions, music, art, dance, singing, short skits, or a mix of everything is welcome.

• **Setup Time:** Allocate **3 minutes** before your performance for any setup or preparation. Ensure all equipment and props are ready within this time.

# 3. Technical Requirements

- **Music and Audio:** If your performance involves music, submit your audio files in advance in a standard format (e.g., MP3, WAV).
- Equipment Needs: Inform the event organizers at least one week before the event if you require specific equipment (e.g., microphones, instruments, playback devices).
- **Props and Costumes:** All props and costumes should be simple to set up and remove within the 3-minute setup window. Ensure your costumes are culturally appropriate and respectful.

# 4. Stage Etiquette

- **Punctuality:** Be ready to perform at your scheduled time. Delays can disrupt the flow of the event.
- **Professionalism:** Maintain professionalism on and off the stage. Treat all performers, volunteers, and audience members with respect.
- **Stage Setup:** If your performance requires specific staging, coordinate with the stage manager during rehearsal to ensure your needs are met within the allocated time.

# 5. Safety and Compliance

- **Safety First:** Ensure that all elements of your performance are safe for you, other performers, and the audience. Avoid using open flames, sharp objects, or other hazardous materials.
- **Compliance:** Follow all venue guidelines and instructions from the event organizers, especially concerning safety and timing.

# 7. Post-Performance

• **Clear the Stage Promptly:** After your performance, clear the stage within 2 minutes to allow the next performer to set up.

By following these guidelines, you contribute to a smooth, respectful, and enriching experience for everyone involved in the Intercultural Talent Night.
